Local Artist Prefers Amateur Status


For Marshall Gilbert of Palisades, art is a uniquely personal experience. He has enjoyed drawing and painting as long as he can remember and the works he has created since 1954 have become "like a calendar of my life". Gilbert has chosen not to offer his works for sale because each is representative of a moment in time. It is, therefore, his desire to pass them on to his children as a family legacy.

Gilbert has time to create only two or three items a year because of his hectic business schedule. He looks forward to retirement as it will allow him time to experiment with new techniques and produce whenever he is inspired, although he has no wish to become a professional artist. Rather, he hopes that art will always remain his way of recording his own life experience. Commercialization would destroy this for him.

Gilbert's training has been as unique to him as his attitude toward art. He is largely self taught, having acquired his skills through experimentation based on conversations with other artists and visits to museums around the world. A fifteen month stint in Germany as a First Lieutenant in the Army afforded him the opportunity to spend much time frequenting the well-known European museums.

Gilbert works in a variety of mediums including: oils, pen and ink, pencil, pastels and charcoal. He has developed what he believes to be a new technique--stippling in oils--which he achieves with paper towels. Stippling involves making slight touches on wet paint. These touches produce minute speckles which together create a softly graded shadow effect.

Below is a reproduction of Gilbert's pen and ink rendering of the Palisades General Store.



The themes of Gilbert's work are as varied as his techniques: woodland scenes, urban landscapes, family portraits, and European towns.

Professionally, Gilbert is head of a division of Spring Mills Corporation where his activities include carpet design. He is also a graduate of the Brooklyn Law School, though he is not presently a practicing attorney.

Samples of Gilbert's work can be viewed occasionally at the Hopper House in Nyack as he submits paintings and drawings to member's shows.
