# Oak Tree Playgroup

One of the nicest parts of my day is when I come home from work and find the current treasure my child has made, found, collected or learned at the Oak Tree Cooperative

or learned at the Cak Tree Cooperative Playgroup.
The Playgroup gathers Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 5 pm in the Palisades Elementary School and the fee is \$1 per hour per child. There is a minimum monthly charge of \$20 (in a 4 week month) or \$5 a week and a \$10 registration charge. It is suggested that children join for at least five hours a week so that each time is not a "first."
The four teachers are Ester Berkowitz, Rita Cooperman, Marianne Armistead and Nina Thayer. All agreed that the Cooperative nature of the group can be helped along if fathers and also

group can be helped along if fathers and also grandparents come in to cooperate along with mothers. The goals of the Playgroup are to provide "a semi-structured environment for preschool children where they will feel free to express their needs and feel confident that these needs be met; and to provide an atmosphere that will encourage creativity, personal growth

and security. If you want to enroll a child and be a cooperator, although your child may attend if you cannot cooperate, call Director Carol Elevitch (359-2995) for more information. Children can join from age 2 and they do not have to have learned to use the bathroom yet! There are cribs for naps and lots of books, toys, games and supplies for playing.

The Playgroup shares the building with the Rockland Center for the Arts and you can ask to have your child taken to an activity over there and picked up if he or she is participating in a class.
